Hawaii Community Federal Credit Union Board members serve on a voluntary basis and are responsible for ensuring the Credit Union serves the financial needs of its members. If you are a current member and interested in serving on the Board, or would like to submit a nomination by petition, please call the Credit Union's Administrative Office at (808) 930-7603 for qualifications, information, and an application packet. All applicants will be required to sign a consent form allowing the Credit Union to conduct a credit and background check before their name is placed on the ballot. A request for an application packet may also be submitted in writing and mailed to:

Petitions must be signed by a minimum of 470 Hawaii Community Federal Credit Union members who are eliaible to vote (members sixteen [16] years of age or older). Along with the petition form, each nominee must submit a statement of qualifications, biographical data, and a completed application packet. The opening date for nominations by petition is February 26, 2024.

The deadline for the Nominations and Elections Committee to receive the completed nominations by petition is 5 pm on March 27, 2024.

Packets may be requested or picked up at Hawaii Community Federal Credit Union's Administrative Office in Kaloko during normal business hours, Monday — Friday from 8 am to 5 pm starting on February 26, 2024. ■



Liquid Courage

Kurtis Tauchert, Owner of Ono Kine Water, runs his business with a simple and pure mission: to provide island communities with high-quality water and exceptional customer service at the lowest possible price.

▶ Growing up in Ventura, California, Kurtis's upbringing was shaped by the care of his single mother, a nurse who dedicated over twenty years of service to a local hospital. As Kurtis embarked on his professional career he followed in his mother's footsteps, working at the same hospital for nearly a decade before transitioning into video production.

Kurtis, a 31-year cancer survivor, enjoys giving back to the community through HCFCU fundraisers and is a steadfast supporter of our work with **American Cancer Society and** three Hawaii Island Hospices.

As his interest and experience in video production continued to grow, so did his professional journey. Kurtis worked as a teacher's assistant, then a video production instructor, and eventually took on producing and directing several TV shows. His career reached new heights when he established his own video production company and was contracted by the US Navy to document homeland security exercises. This endeavor led him to travel across the country and eventually brought him to Hawai'i, where he first fell in love with the islands. As fate would have it, the economic downturn in 2012 provided an opportunity for Kurtis, wife Shannon, their sons Michael and Koen, and Shannon's grandmother to relocate to Kona that summer.

While managing his production company remotely, Kurtis juggled three part-time jobs, one of which was with a water vending company. In 2017, the owner of that company sold the business to Kurtis and Shannon, who quickly rebranded into the company we know today as Ono Kine Water. Over the next two years, they replaced and refurbished every water kiosk machine, and today, proudly provide high-quality purified water to 23 locations on Hawaii Island and

three locations on Oahu.

Kurtis, a 31-year cancer survivor, enjoys giving back to the community through HCFCU fundraisers and is a steadfast supporter of our work with Hawaii Island hospices, as Shannon's grandmother received hospice care for two years here. Looking ahead, Kurtis and Shannon plan to establish their own local charity aimed at addressing the unique needs of our community.

Q: What are the most important personal satisfactions connected with your business?

I derive immense pleasure from working outdoors and interacting with individuals. Our primary objective upon relocating here

was to offer a valuable service to the community, and we have always strived to achieve that.

Q: What advice would you offer to others looking to become more active or engaged in their community?

Q: What motivated you and Shannon to start your own local charity, and what specific community needs do you aim to address with this initiative?

In our hometown, we actively participated in diverse organizations, delighting in sharing our innovative ideas with them. However, since settling in Kona, we have discovered numerous areas where we aspire to make a difference. Our focus lies on three crucial areas: nurturing youth sports, supporting animal rescue efforts, and aiding the homeless community.

Q: Can you share a memorable experience or success story related to your involvement with Hawaii Community FCU?

When my son met his future wife, he made the decision to relocate to the mainland and join the Navy. During their time in California, they were blessed with the arrival of a beautiful baby. Despite my son's absence for a year, the compassionate staff members went above and beyond by presenting him with a heartfelt gift for the newborn.

Q: If there is one word you could use to describe your experience with Hawaii Community FCU, what would it be and why?

Kindness. The staff's kindness has touched me on numerous occasions, from the thoughtful baby gift they presented to my grandson, to their genuine concern and support during my recent open-heart surgery.

HOPE Services Kupuna Affordable Housing Project

Hawaii Community FCU Furnishes Home for Kupuna, Wins HOPE Services Home Design Contest.

HCFCU continues its commitment to supporting kupuna by furnishing a comfortable living space at the Sacred Heart Affordable Housing Project in Pahoa.

"We are proud to be part of this collaborative effort that prioritizes the well-being of our kupuna," said Tricia Buskirk, CEO and President at HCFCU. "This project reflects our ongoing dedication to enhancing the lives of our elderly community members."

Originally targeted for a December 2020 move-in, the project faced delays due to challenges stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic, extending the completion date to November 2023. HCFCU, a longstanding partner of HOPE Services, participated in a home design contest held by HOPE Services, inviting local organizations to decorate and furnish homes within the project.

Embracing the opportunity, HCFCU signed on to sponsor one of the housing units to create a welcoming home for its future occupant. Upon completion, HOPE Services invited the community to cast votes for their favorite designs. With over 62% of the popular vote, HCFCU won the contest, in a celebration of their thoughtful touches and inviting décor.

"Our partnership with HOPE Services underscores our commitment to providing dignified spaces for these important members of our community," noted Buskirk. "Our goal is to ensure kupuna have a sense of belonging and security in their new home."

The history between HCFCU and HOPE Services spans several years, with HCFCU designating HOPE as their triennial beneficiary. From 2019 — 2021, HCF-CU raised over \$82K to support the organization's various initiatives. In continuation of this partnership, HCFCU pledged to sponsor a home at the Sacred Heart Affordable Housing Project. ■
