We are pleased to report that the renovation of the Kailua-Kona Branch that started in April 2022 is progressing very nicely.

The branch was tentatively scheduled to reopen after the first phase of construction.

After careful consideration, we determined that the limited branch services we had planned to offer during construction would have created an experience that was far below our members' standards. Our assessment of the extent of the renovation and the interim conditions of the branch led us to make this determination. The Kailua-Kona Branch will remain closed until the renovation is complete, which is tentatively scheduled for February 2023.

Kailua-Kona Branch members will continue to be served at the Kaloko Branch located 5 miles away at 73-5611 Olowalu Street in the Kaloko Industrial Park or at the Kealakekua Branch located 9 miles away at 81-6631 Mamalahoa Hwy. Members may also use the convenience of our online or mobile banking and bill pay service for convenient, 24/7 access to conduct your business anywhere, anytime.

What are the updates to the renovation?

The renovation will update the branch layout with a modern design that creates convenience, enhanced security and elevates the member experience.

Members can look forward to the following upgrades:

- Installation of a drive-up ATM.
- Secure 24-hour vestibule with two ATMs and a night depository.
- Tech bar that provides information on HCFCU's products and services electronically.
- Biometric access to the safe deposit box area.
- Imagery within the branch highlighting our roots and significant dates throughout our history.

Renovation/Construction timelines.

The branch is tentatively scheduled to re-open in February 2023.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work to improve your experience at our Kailua-Kona branch. Please note that all dates are subject to change. We promise, it will be worth it!

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

AUDREY MAXWELL-HODGDON & DAPHNE MCKEEHAN

- Convenience Plus **-**

Convenience Plus was opened in 2003 by sisters Audrey Maxwell-Hodgdon and Daphne McKeehan. It seemed logical that they joined to open a Convenience Store/Fueling station, as they grew up in the business owned by their father Alfred (Fred) Jose Andrade, Sr. since 1960. Convenience Plus is a family business employing 14 community members.

The current building was constructed in 1959 by the Hamakua Sugar Company's Construction Division. Mr. Andrade built the gas station, repair shop and its canopy area and continued its structure to the rear of the gas station utilizing military barrack quasits that he purchased from Camp Tarawa in Waimea. These quasit buildings were in use from 1943-1945 but since World War II had ended, they were sold as surplus to the public. The station's grand opening event was held on March 5th, 1960, and the business was named Andrade Service Inc. which also incorporated part of his excavation/land clearing business into it. The name Convenience Plus was given to the business when the sisters began running it in 2003.

What are the most important personal satisfactions connected with your profession?

Serving the community has been the main focus of the business. Opening as early as 4am to closing at 11pm. The pandemic changed the store hours but not the desire to serve. Convenience Plus has a large generator with the capability of powering the store, providing ice and fuel during power outages.

How was your business impacted during the COVID-19 pandemic?

Convenience Plus did not close at any time during the COVID-19 pandemic, however we did reduce our hours, making employee schedule changes as necessary. We increased areas of disinfection and wrapped our hot dog buns and utensils. We also started selling individual masks for those trying to enter without a mask. Everyone entering was monitored for masks and mandated to sanitize their hands using our hands-free hand sanitizer dispensing unit.

Do you feel that HCFCU played a role in your business outcome during the pandemic?

During this difficult time, Convenience Plus relied on the HCFCU for financial help and advice to continue on. HCFCU's assistance became akin to a business partnership enhancing continued viability and productivity. We are truly appreciative of all the help received during this transitional part of our business life.

If there is one word you could use to describe your experience with us, what would it be and why?

The word is 'Solid' because we can always count on HCFCU for all our needs, both business and personal. We know that we can walk in with a question, need, or concern and always come out with a solid solution.

Do you have any other stories you'd like to share?

Many of our childhood memories revolved around the gas station as we both worked there since we were about 9 or 10 years old. Back then, our customers never got out of their vehicle. We not only pumped their gas, but we also checked the oil, water in the radiator, air pressure in tires and cleaned their windshield. I can't remember any time that I received a tip. Back then it was a service expected with any fuel purchase. Imagine that! One of the pluses of growing up next to the gas station was the ability to get candy and hot chocolate from my dad's vending machines. He also vended chicken noodle soup, coffee, ice cream, soda, bubble gum and cigarettes.

Our grandmother, Rose Andrade Correa, donated land to the County for a rodeo arena and one of her sons (our uncle), William Andrade Sr., was one of the founding fathers of the Hawaii Saddle Club (1954). Since then, many of Rose's children, grand and great grandchildren, have continued to participate as entrants and rodeo club members today. Convenience Plus continues to support the rodeo in as many ways possible.

STAYALERT, AVOIDS CAMS

- WATCH OUT FOR SKIMMING -

Credit and debit card skimming is when potential thieves steal or "skim" your card information. They use it to create an illegal copy of your card (called "cloning") or to charge items to your card over the phone or internet. They may even sell it to others to do the same.

THIEVES USE SKIMMING DEVICES THAT ARE SMALL, EASILY PORTABLE, AND HARD TO DETECT. Certain types are illegally installed on ATM machines and sales terminals such as those on gas pumps. Even chip-equipped cards may not be safe.

CARD SKIMMERS FIT OVER ORIGINAL CARD READERS. As you insert your card, the account information stored on it is skimmed by the device. Keypad overlays are placed directly on top of factory-installed keypads. The circuitry inside the overlay stores your keystrokes, such as those you make when you enter your PIN. Thieves also may install hidden cameras to record you entering your PIN.

TRY TO USE ONLY ATMS INSIDE OF FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS, which tend to have more oversight and be less vulnerable to tampering. Devices are more often installed on ATMs not located at financial institutions.

AT AN ATM OR SALES TERMINAL, CHECK TO SEE IF THE COLORS AND MATERIALS USED MATCH UP. Look for an extra piece of plastic or anything that appears added on, wrong, or out of place. These can be signs of skimming devices.

DON'T USE THE MACHINE IF ANYTHING LOOKS SUSPICIOUS. IT'S BETTER TO BE SAFE THAN SORRY.

SOME KEY THINGS TO REMEMBER

HIDDEN CAMERAS Can be placed in many areas and record from different angles. Always cover the hand entering your PIN.

CARD SKIMMERS If you suspect a card reader is fitted with a skimmer, jiggle it. If it moves or seems loose, don't insert your card.

KEYPAD OVERLAY If a keypad looks thick, seems raised, or is loose when wiggled, it could be a keypad overlay. Don't use it.

REMEMBER - IF ANYTHING LOOKS FUNNY OR DOESN'T FEEL RIGHT, WALK AWAY!

PREPARE YOUR FINANCES FOR Season, Preparing for hurricane season takes more than stocking up on extra batteries.

It also means being prepared financially while ensuring important documents are kept organized and away from where they could be lost or damaged. Getting your financial records and documents in order now can save you time and stress following a hurricane or other emergency.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) recommends creating a budget for expenses related to disasters, such as insurance deductibles, costs related to evacuations and essentials like gas, food, shelter and emergency medical help. It's also a good idea to consider an emergency savings account to be ready when an emergency arises.

FEMA offers an Emergency Financial First Aid Kit on its website to help you keep track of important documents, records, and contact information you may need in the aftermath of a disaster, such as a hurricane. The kit also includes a checklist to help you keep track of financial and legal documentation.

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) suggests taking an inventory of your possessions with video or photos, which could help you if you need to file an insurance claim. The FTC also recommends keeping one hard copy of the inventory in a fire-proof, lockable file box in your home and a second copy either in a safe deposit box or saved on a device such as a USB flash drive or external hard drive kept at a safe location away from home.

Hawaii Community Federal Credit Union currently offers safe deposit boxes at all our branches except our Honokaa Branch. Call us at 808-930-7700 or visit your one of our branches for availability and additional information.

Other documents to consider storing in a safe deposit box include property leases, deeds and titles for your home and any vehicles; financial agreements, appraisals of expensive jewelry and heirlooms as well as certificates for any stocks, bonds, or other investments you may have.

The key to your safe deposit box should be kept in a fire-proof, lockable file box along with a small amount of cash in case ATMs and financial institutions are closed. The FTC recommends keeping the file box on a shelf in a secure and accessible place where it can be easily grabbed in the event of an emergency.
