# 2021 Board Nominations

Hawaii Community Federal Credit Union will be accepting nominations to fill 3 positions on our Board. Each position carries a three-year term and will begin in May 2021. Hawaii Community Federal Credit Union Board members serve on a voluntary basis and are responsible for ensuring the Credit Union serves the financial needs of its members. If you are a current member and interested in serving on the Board, or would like to submit a nomination by petition, please call the Credit Union's Administrative Office at **(808) 930-7603** for qualifications, information and an application packet. All applicants will be required to sign a consent form allowing the Credit Union to conduct a credit and background check before their name is placed on the ballot.

Petitions must be signed by a minimum of four hundred forty (440) Hawaii Community Federal Credit Union members who are eligible to vote (members sixteen [16] years of age or older). Along with the petition form, each nominee must submit a statement of qualifications, biographical data, and a completed application packet. The opening date for nominations by petition is **February 22, 2021**.

The deadline for the Nominations and Elections Committee to receive the completed nominations by petition is 5 pm on **March 24, 2021**.

Packets may be requested or picked up at Hawaii Community Federal Credit Union's Administrative Office in Kaloko during normal business hours, Monday – Friday from 8 am to 5 pm starting on **February 22, 2021**.

Through the support of donations and pledges from our staff across all six branches, we are pleased to announce that our credit union raised more than \$22,000 for Children's Miracle Network Hospitals benefiting Kapi'olani Medical Center for Women & Children. This number includes more than \$19,000 raised through our annual employee giving program and \$1,000 raised on Miracle Jeans Day on Sept. 9. These fundraisers were also supported by a \$2,200 donation from Co-Op Financial Services via its Miracle Match program. Kapi'olani Medical Center for Women & Children is the state's only specialty care facility for women and children. Proud to be the only tertiary pediatric and perinatal facility in Hawai'i, Kapi'olani houses the state's only pediatric intensive care unit serving all islands and the Pacific Basin. The hospital is home to 197 beds and 90 neonatal bassinets as well as a 24-hour pediatric emergency room servicing more than 20,000 patients a year. Thank you to all of our staff members who helped demonstrate our organization's commitment to our communities and its families!
